EASEE-gas contribution to ACER's public consultation on the preliminary scoping on potential Framework Guidelines on Rules for Trading

Dear Madam or Sir

EASEE-gas appreciates the opportunity to comment on the Preliminary scoping document on potential "FG rules for trading related to technical and operational provisions of network access services and system balancing (FG RfT)".

EASEE-gas is representing most of the gas market segments within Europe. All our members are operating in different gas network systems, each with their own state of implemented and interpreted Network Codes (NCs). Interpretation of existing NCs and different time schedules of implementing them raises today already some difficulties amongst the stakeholders. Since most of the topics mentioned in the "Preliminary scoping document for public consultation" are already partly taken care of in existing NCs, EASEE-gas does not support the potential adoption of an additional set of rules which may lead to a new NC, because, as a general thought, enough time to both implement and evaluate the NCs recently approved by the European authorities has to be observed. If the market sees any omissions in the Guidelines on CMP and the Network Codes on CAM, Balancing and Interoperability & Data exchange, then it will be easier to amend the existing NCs at a later stage.

EASEE-gas opines that adding today another NC will negatively impact the survey ability of the relevant rules. Most importantly, the focus of all market participants should be aimed on implementing correctly existing Guidelines and NCs; it is only after their effect on the market has been thoroughly examined and evaluated, that any proposals on amendments of these NCs would make sense. We therefore support a greater effort around the harmonization on interpretation and implementation of the existing NCs in the different gas transport systems.
